


Now those who were scattered went about preaching the word Acts 8:4

In your great mercy, answer me O God. Gospel reading Matthew 10:24-39

Here the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew

Jesus summoned the twelve and sent them out with the following instruction:

A disciple is not above the teacher, nor a slave above the master; it is enough for the disciple to be like the teacher, and the slave like the master. If they have called the master of the house Beelzebul, how much more will they malign those of his household! So have no fear of them; for nothing is covered up that will not be uncovered, and nothing secret that will not become known. What I say to you in the dark, tell in the light; and what you hear whispered, proclaim from the housetops. Do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather fear him who can destroy both soul and body in hell. Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? Yet not one of them will fall to the ground apart from your Father. And even the hairs of your head are all counted. So do not be afraid; you are of more value than many sparrows. Everyone therefore who acknowledges me before others, I also will acknowledge before my Father in heaven; but whoever denies me before others, I also will deny before my Father in heaven. Do not think that I have come to bring peace to the earth; I have not come to bring peace, but a sword. For I have come to set a man against his father, and a daughter against her mother, and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law: 36and one's foes will be members of one's own household. Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever does not take up the cross and follow me is not worthy of me. Those who find their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it. Amen

Reflection

The most repeated command in the New Testament surprised me. The most repeated command is 'do not be afraid.' In this passage alone Jesus says do not be afraid three times.

The first reference to fear in the bible is Adam and Eve, before they sinned they did not experience fear. But after they disobeyed God we find the first expression of fear. Since that time, fear has been part of our human existence, and never more than at this time.

Fear is coming from all sides today, fear of illness, fear of economic collapse, fear of large scale conflicts overseas, fear of inequality and fear of climate change.

Fear can be debilitating fear can stop us achieving our full potential and fear can paralyze us. Jesus is not forbidding experiencing the emotion of fear but teaching his disciples that they are not to be paralyzed by it, cowered by it, or prevented from accomplishing their mission because of it.

He does not say that following him will be easy, it will not. He says no servant is above his master what happens to him will happen to them, he is persecuted they will be persecuted. They will be misunderstood, there will be family conflict. They will become separated from the Jewish race.

When I first became a Licensed Lay Minister I soon found that some of my old friends and I would never be as close as we once were. If anyone ever tries to tell you that following Jesus is easy- don't believe them. It is the hardest thing you will ever attempt to do. Some will mock and question and belittle.

Jesus says , 'Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it.'

If we are going to be followers of Jesus Christ, we can forget about playing it safe. If we like to be comfortable and not think too much about the troubles of our neighbour then Christianity is not for us, if we want to take the easy way and only spend time with those who are 'just like us' instead of sitting with the rough sleeper who has not showered for a while, then Christianity is not for us. Christianity is 'messy business.'

Jesus says, 'anyone who does not take his cross and follow me is not worthy of me'

To be a follower of Jesus Christ means that we will not only endure inconvenience, but rather, like Jesus, we must willingly choose to sacrifice everything, including family and life itself, to be a true follower. However Jesus is with us every step of the way he is saying 'I'm here. Don't be afraid' Amen

Prayers and intercessions

Jesus Christ, you travelled through towns and villages curing every disease and illness. At your command, the sick were made well. Come to our aid now, in the midst of the global spread of the coronavirus, that we may experience your healing love.

Heal those who are sick with the virus. May they regain their strength and health through quality medical care.

Heal us from our fear, which prevents nations from working together and neighbours from helping one another.

Heal us from our pride, which can make us claim invulnerability to a disease that knows no borders.

Jesus Christ, healer of all, stay by our side in this time of uncertainty and sorrow.

Be with those who have died from the virus. May they be at rest with you in your eternal peace.

Be with the families of those who are sick or have died. As they worry and grieve, defend them from illness and despair. May they know your peace.

Be with the doctors, nurses, researchers and all medical professionals who seek to heal and help those affected and who put themselves at risk in the process. May they know your protection and peace.

Be with the leaders of all nations. Give them the foresight to act with charity and true concern for the well-being of the people they are meant to serve. Give them the wisdom to invest in long-term solutions that will help prepare for or prevent future outbreaks. May they know your peace, as they work together to achieve it on earth.

Whether we are home or abroad, surrounded by many people suffering from this illness or only a few, Jesus Christ, stay with us as we endure and mourn, persist and prepare. In place of our anxiety, give us your peace.

Jesus Christ, heal us. Amen.
